

Villeneuve Airport is a general aviation airport located northwest of the City of Edmonton. It is the primary flight-training facility for the region. Its NAV CANADA air traffic control tower operates daily from 8:00 am to 9:00 pm. The terminal located next to the tower accommodates a NAV CANADA Flight Information Kiosk.

History

Villeneuve Airport was built by Transport Canada in 1976 as a flight training facility for the region. The air traffic control tower was built in 1982. In 2000, Villeneuve Airport was purchased by Edmonton Regional Airport Authority from the Government of Canada with the strategic objective of managing efficient operations in the Edmonton region. It has two runways. Runway 16-34 and the Main Apron were rehabilitated in 2005 and Runway 08-26 and Taxiway Bravo were reconstructed in 2006. In 2013, runway 08-26 was extended from 3500 to 5000 feet.

Economic Impact

Villeneuve Airport is home to 19 businesses, covering such activities as aircraft flight training, fixed-wing aircraft maintenance, helicopter maintenance and aviation operations. Total economic impact is:

- \$19 million in economic output
- About 100 direct jobs

Growth and Development

In 2013, Edmonton Airports developed the Villeneuve Airport strategic plan to build the airport into a strategic regional asset, meeting the needs of the communities it serves as well as its corporate and recreational users. The plan identifies the key success factors:

- Reduce operational loss
- Grow general aviation traffic
- Grow non-aeronautical revenue
- Maintain strong collaborative working relationships

A significant amount of new, privately-funded development is currently taking place at Villeneuve Airport. Phase 2 development is underway. For more information about hangar space please visit:

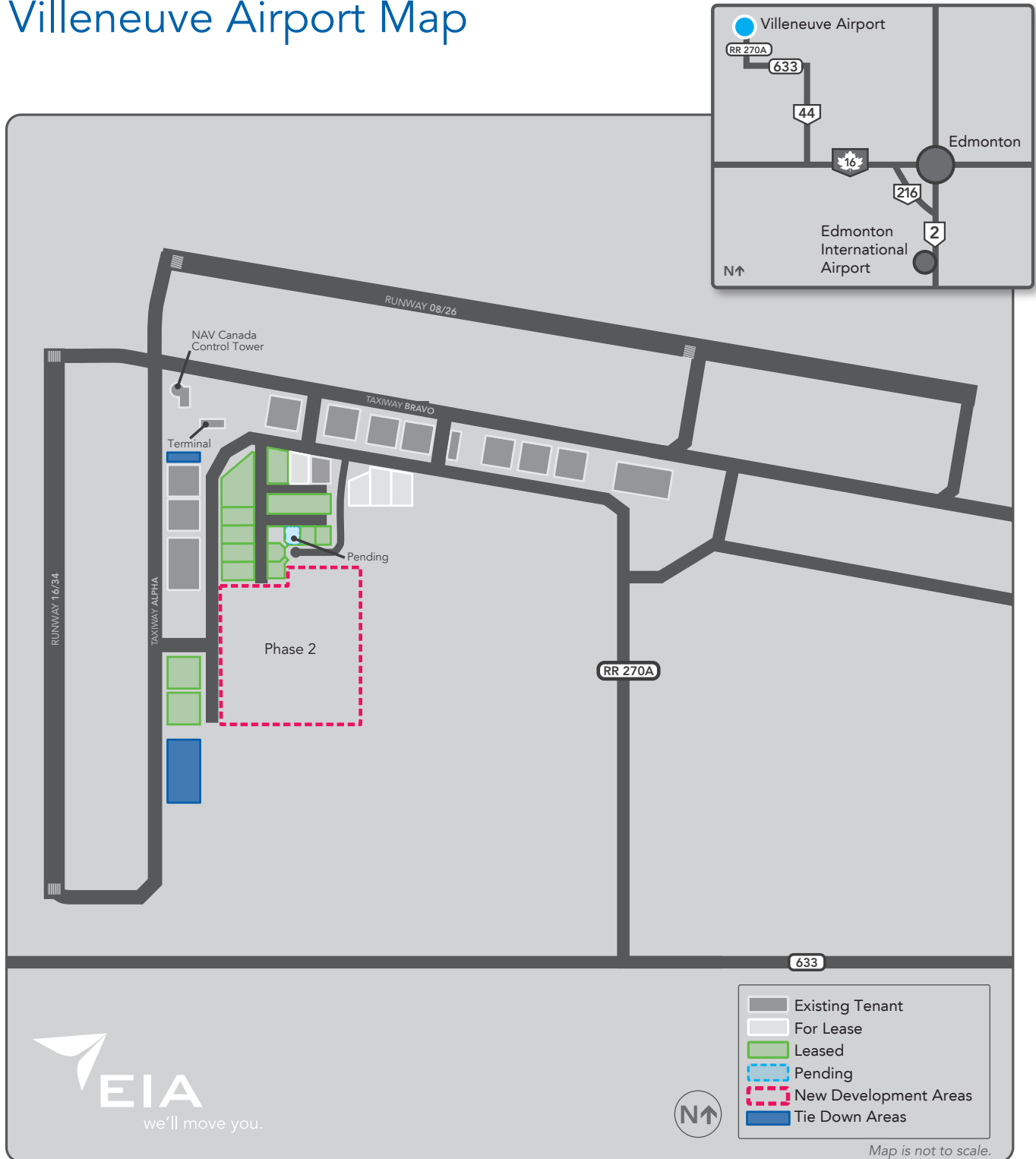
